

Theology vs. Practical Religion

I can think of no better time than Lent to ask you to consider the merits of theology versus practical religion. (Think of theology as encompassing studying, reading, and talking about God. Think of practical religion as experiences with and of God.)

I found in my reflection time several weeks ago a passage from C.S. Lewis' *The Joyful* Christian in which Lewis considers the merits of each, using a powerful analogy. He introduces the analogy by telling the story of a man who once told Lewis that he had no use for theological talk but preferred experience. At that point, Lewis introduce his analogy of a map:

In the same way, if a man has once looked at the Atlantic [Ocean] from the beach, and then goes and looks at a map of the Atlantic, he also will be turning from real waves to a bit of colored paper. But here comes the point...there are two things you have to remember about [the map]. In the first place, it is based on what hundreds and thousands of people have found out by sailing the real Atlantic. In that way, it has behind it masses of experience just as real as the one you could have from the beach; only, while yours would by a single isolated glimpse, the map fits all those different experiences together. In the second place, if you want to go anywhere, the map is absolutely necessary. As long as you are content with walks on the beach, your own glimpses are far more fun than looking at a map. But the map is going to be more use than walks on a beach if you want to get to America.


I don't know how you interpret Lewis' words, but I hear that both practical religion (our own personal experiences of God) AND theology (in the context of a Christian community known as Church) are absolutely necessary. Our individual experiences give us amazing and unique insights into God and should be treasured. At the same time, adding to our own experiences those of others gives us a much greater understanding of God's fullness and even gives us cause to seek ever more in our own experience with God. Even moreso, the map of others' experiences provides us with a map for continued growth in our relationships with God.

This Lenten season, it is my hope that you will both grow in your own relationship with God and seek the wisdom of others around you (and those who have come before you), so you can find new and amazing ways to grow in your relationship with God!

El Salvador Mission Trip 2015

The El Salvador Mission Trip planning is well underway. I will be leaving on July 26, and returning on August 8. Once again, we will be working on the schools in the little town of Las Trincheras and any other needs that God presents to us.

I am asking now if there are any people in our congregation, or who you might know, who are interested in accompanying us.

This two week trip will change you in a way that I can't describe. You will laugh, you will cry, and your heart will move. The work isn't glamorous, and you saw the pictures of me at my most unglamorous self, but I wouldn't change that for a minute and am compelled to return to the sunny, happy, loveable people of El Salvador.

The cost is \$1500 for room, board, translators, and transportation in country. Airfare is probably around \$800. We book together. If the only thing holding you back from this experience is money, please see me. There may be a scholarship available, or we can work together on a fundraiser.

If you are unable to go, there are many other ways you can contribute to this mission. When it gets a little closer, I will talk about it, but for now please prayerfully consider coming along!

Palm Sunday

On Palm Sunday, the Sunday before Easter, we celebrate Jesus' entry into Jerusalem amidst the joyful welcome of his followers, and we consider how the joy transitioned so quickly into calls for Jesus to be crucified. Our worshipful celebration will begin with the waving of Palms and something special to remind us of that procession so long ago. Come, worship, celebrate, and consider how the joy could change so quickly to crucifixion.




Maundy Thursday Seder Meal

Each Thursday of Holy Week (the week leading up to Easter Sunday), Christians commemorate Jesus' Last Supper when he broke bread and gave the cup to his disciples. Periodically, Christians also gather on that night to partake of a Passover Seder meal, a ritual meal that three of the four gospels strongly suggest was the setting for the Last Supper and a meal that is full of symbolism that helps provide meaning to the events surrounding Jesus' crucifixion. Please plan to join us as we celebrate the Passover Seder this year on Maundy Thursday, April 2, at 6 pm. *Advance signup is required (so we have enough food.)*





Please make plans to participate in our congregation's annual Easter Prayer Vigil. Just as Jesus' disciples gathered in the Garden of Gethsemene after the Passover meal on Maundy Thursday to pray (as Jesus commanded them), so too will we gather to pray following the Passover meal this Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. Please watch for a sign-up sheet on the Sign-Up table in the Fellowship Hall, and find 30 minutes to keep awake and pray (either at the church building or in your home.)



Journey to the Cross

Holy Week is the time when Christians traditionally re-live the events of Jesus' last week (and weeks) on earth. In recent times, Christians have reduced Holy Week to just a few events and worship services (typically Palm Sunday and Maundy Thursday.) If you would like to truly remember and re-live the events leading to the cross, plan to spend 30-60 minutes in the sanctuary between 8 p.m. Maundy Thursday (April 2) and 8 p.m. Good Friday (April 3). While in the sanctuary, you will travel on a self-guided tour of the events of Jesus last week(s), and you will be encouraged to consider how those events impact your life today and into the future. *No sign-up required.*



Easter Brunch

Every year, we celebrate Jesus' Resurrection on Easter Sunday with worship and brunch. Please plan to attend this year's Easter Brunch and celebrate Jesus' resurrection with your whole church family. The brunch will take place on Easter Sunday, April 5, at 10a.m. (in between our two worship services.)
