

What Are You Going to Do About Easter?

This year, our gospel reading for Easter Sunday is Mark 16:1-8, which tells the story of three women visiting Jesus' tomb on the original Easter Sunday and discovering the tomb to be empty. They also find at the tomb "a young man, dressed in a white robe." This man tells them that Jesus has been raised, and he tells them to go and tell Jesus' disciples (and Peter) that Jesus is alive and will meet up with them in Galilee. The reading then ends with these words: "So [the three women] went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid" (Mark 16:8).

Mark's gospel, as we currently have it, continues from that point, offering a few resurrection appearances by Jesus and a brief telling of Jesus' ascension. However, the earliest manuscripts known to exist of Mark's gospel end at Mark 16:8. There are many theories as to why (and I encourage you to research them), but I want to propose just one today.

I believe Mark wrote his gospel both to persuade readers/hearers that Jesus is the Messiah AND to encourage readers/hearers into action. There are many reasons I believe this to be the case, but I will focus now on the ending of the gospel, Mark 16:8. When we complete our reading of Mark's gospel, we are left to believe that the original witnesses to Jesus resurrection may not have shared what they knew to be true, so...it's up to us to share what we know to be true (or maybe no one will)!

It is my belief that we are in a critical time in our nation and as a congregation. If people like us don't share what we know to be true, loudly and boldly, other voices will continue to try to silence Christianity. More specifically, if we in this congregation don't share what we know to be true with friends and neighbors and even acquaintances, God just might decide to hand God's vision for us off to someone who will. What are YOU going to do about Easter – keep it a secret or share it?

Dear Christian Friends,

There are two important ideas I would like to introduce to you. Some may be aware of these, but for those who don't know about them, this might benefit you.

- 1.) There is information you can put in your cell phone called "ICE". This stands for "In Case of Emergency". If you have a spouse or someone who you'd call if something happened to you, such as if you were in an accident and couldn't talk, the emergency officials could look in your cell phone and contact them. All you need to do I put the letters "ICE" in front of your contact's name.
- 2.) The second item I'd like to bring to your attention is that is you put in your wallet your primary doctor's name and phone number on a piece of paper with a list of your medicines, the strength and the frequency you take them, an emergency department might be able to treat you faster. Put tape over the paper to protect it and put it in the back of where you keep your driver's license, making it a little taller than your license. Jim and I each have a medication list in our wallets and it says, "In Case of Emergency" on the very top. And if you are allergic to a medication or anything else, this should go on the paper also.

If you need help making this, we would be happy to help.

El Salvador Mission Trip 2015

The El Salvador Mission Trip planning is well underway. I will be leaving on July 26, and returning on August 8. Once again, we will be working on the schools in the little town of Las Trincheras and any other needs that God presents to us.

I am asking now if there are any people in our congregation, or who you might know, who are interested in accompanying us.

This two week trip will change you in a way that I can't describe. You will laugh, you will cry, and your heart will move. The work isn't glamorous, and you saw the pictures of me at my most unglamorous self, but I wouldn't change that for a minute. Additionally, I am compelled to return to the sunny, happy, loveable people of El Salvador.

The cost is \$1500 for room, board, translators, and transportation in the country. Airfare is probably around \$800. We book together. If the only thing holding you back from this experience is money, please see me. There may be a scholarship available, or we can work together on a fundraiser.

If you are unable to go, there are many other ways you can contribute to this mission. When it gets a little closer, I will talk about it, but for now please prayerfully consider coming along!


Maundy Thursday Seder Meal

Each Thursday of Holy Week (the week leading up to Easter Sunday), Christians commemorate Jesus' Last Supper when he broke bread and gave the cup to his disciples. Periodically, Christians also gather on that night to partake of a Passover Seder meal, a ritual meal that three of the four gospels strongly suggest was the setting for the Last Supper and a meal that is full of symbolism that helps provide meaning to the events surrounding Jesus' crucifixion. Please plan to join us as we celebrate the Passover Seder this year on Maundy Thursday, April 2, at 6 pm. *Advance signup is required (so we have enough food.)*



Easter Prayer Vigil

Please make plans to participate in our congregation's annual Easter Prayer Vigil. Just as Jesus' disciples gathered in the Garden of Gethsemene after the Passover meal on Maundy Thursday to pray (as Jesus commanded them), so too will we gather to pray following the Passover meal this Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. Please watch for a sign-up sheet on the Sign-Up table in the Fellowship Hall, and find 30 minutes to keep awake and pray (either at the church building or in your home.)



Journey to the Cross

Holy Week is the time when Christians traditionally re-live the events of Jesus' last week (and weeks) on earth. In recent times, Christians have reduced Holy Week to just a few events and worship services (typically Palm Sunday and Maundy Thursday.) If you would like to truly remember and re-live the events leading to the cross, plan to spend 30-60 minutes in the sanctuary between 8 p.m. Maundy Thursday (April 2) and 8 p.m. Good Friday (April 3). While in the sanctuary, you will travel on a self-guided tour of the events of Jesus last week(s), and you will be encouraged to consider how those events impact your life today and into the future. *No sign-up required.*

Every year, we celebrate Jesus' Resurrection on Easter Sunday with worship and brunch. Please plan to attend this year's Easter Brunch and celebrate Jesus' resurrection with your whole church family. The brunch will take place on Easter Sunday, April 5, at 10a.m. (in between our two worship services.)




