


## When is Eternal Life?

We just celebrated Easter and God's amazing act of conquering death. Now, it's time for us to figure out the meaning of this abundant reality in our own lives. Hopefully, one of the questions that is raised for you by the event of Jesus' resurrection is one that I think about quite regularly: when is eternal life?

I know, it sounds like a strange question. If you're like me, you were raised to believe that eternal life begins after our lives here on this earth – in this lifetime – end. It's the kind of thinking that has given rise to great hope for people who experience difficulties in this lifetime; they can look forward to an eternal future that is different from the pain they experience now. And that's what I thought without even questioning for about 30 years of my life. However, the more I dug into the scriptures, the more I found Jesus offering people something in the here and now, in this lifetime, in those same moments that Jesus was talking about "eternal" life. And, I started reading the works of others, like Carlo Carretto, who wrote things like, "and above all I experienced joy, true joy, that stands above the vicissitudes of life, as soon as I tasted and experienced for myself the gift he came to bestow on us: eternal life" (from *In Search of the Beyond*.) Such words got me to wondering: how could Carretto experience something here and now that doesn't happen until after we die?

Folks, here is the amazing thing that I have discovered about the gift of eternal life: it is both now and in the hereafter. Eternal is a never-ending that doesn't begin in some future life; it begins NOW. The good news offered from this realization is that we can experience now the same quality of life that we will find in God's kingdom in the hereafter if only we choose to live in God's kingdom while on this earth. Eternal life can and will begin for you as soon as you spend your time praising God, praying, reading scripture, and helping others in life the way Jesus did. Then, that same eternal life will go one without ceasing...ever! That's the good news of Easter!

Dear Christian Friends,

There are two important ideas I would like to introduce to you. Some may be aware of these, but for those who don't know about them, this might benefit you.

- 1.) There is information you can put in your cell phone called "ICE". This stands for "In Case of Emergency". If you have a spouse or someone who you'd call if something happened to you, such as if you were in an accident and couldn't talk, the emergency officials could look in your cell phone and contact them. All you need to do I put the letters "ICE" in front of your contact's name.
- 2.) The second item I'd like to bring to your attention is that is you put in your wallet your primary doctor's name and phone number on a piece of paper with a list of your medicines, the strength and the frequency you take them, an emergency department might be able to treat you faster. Put tape over the paper to protect it and put it in the back of where you keep your driver's license, making it a little taller than your license. Jim and I each have a medication list in our wallets and it says, "In Case of Emergency" on the very top. And if you are allergic to a medication or anything else, this should go on the paper also.

If you need help making this, we would be happy to help.

# El Salvador Mission Trip 2015

The El Salvador Mission Trip planning is well underway. I will be leaving on July 26, and returning on August 8. Once again, we will be working on the schools in the little town of Las Trincheras and any other needs that God presents to us.

I am asking now if there are any people in our congregation, or who you might know, who are interested in accompanying us.

This two week trip will change you in a way that I can't describe. You will laugh, you will cry, and your heart will move. The work isn't glamorous, and you saw the pictures of me at my most unglamorous self, but I wouldn't change that for a minute. Additionally, I am compelled to return to the sunny, happy, loveable people of El Salvador.

The cost is \$1500 for room, board, translators, and transportation in the country. Airfare is probably around \$800. We book together. If the only thing holding you back from this experience is money, please see me. There may be a scholarship available, or we can work together on a fundraiser.

If you are unable to go, there are many other ways you can contribute to this mission. When it gets a little closer, I will talk about it, but for now please prayerfully consider coming along!

#### -A NOTE FROM STEWARDSHIP-

Taking a look at our books for the months of January and February and comparing them with the same months in 2014 is almost like deja vu. Obviously, to calculate (for lack of a better term) profit and loss, you subtract expenses from income. For the first two months of 2015 this means that our expenses have exceeded our income by about \$750.00.

While our hope is that the bottom line will always yield a positive number, the good news is that, it is better than last year at the same time when we were a little over \$5800.00 in the hole.

Now, as I am learning, there's more to this stewardship business than simply subtracting expenses from income and calling it good. Given the various sources of income coming in, e.g. rent from condominiums donated by Harold and Ruth Moss, CD's and savings account, special offerings etc., it's a challenge just to track and keep a record of how and when money moves through our system to the various ministries, building expenses, utilities, office supplies, salaries and so on. We are blessed to have Bill and Lily Fitch who provide the technical expertise to guide us through the process in a logical and transparent manner.

I think I speak for all us of when I say that we are proud of our church and our mission to serve as the Disciples of Christ in our community. I hope we also remember that much of what we do is supported by the generosity of our congregation. Just as "many hands make light work" even a small increase in the weekly tithing by each member of our congregation can make a big difference in our bottom line.
