

Something New (Maybe): The Narrative Lectionary

I was hoping to be able to write this article from The Festival of Homiletics (FOH), which is taking place in Denver this week (May 11-15). In fact, you likely noticed on your bulletin calendar from last Sunday that I have been out of the office all this week and you might have been wondering where I am. By the time you read this, I will have spent the week at that very same FOH. Every year, I take about a week to participate in some form of continuing education for ministers. Last year, I attended Group's Future of the Church Summit. This year, I am attending FOH, which, according to the event's website, is "a weeklong conference that brings together a wide variety of outstanding preachers and professors of homiletics to inspire a discourse about preaching and worship, as well as issues related to congregations in the 21st century." (By the way, the word "homiletics" means "the study of the art of preaching or writing sermons.")

As I mentioned, I was hoping to be able to write this article from the Festival, so I could share with you some of the wisdom gained while I am there. However, as I started looking at my very busy schedule for each day (we start at 8:45am and have scheduled lectures and worship services until 9:30-10:00pm each night), I began to wonder if that was a good idea. Instead, I decided to share with you one of the reasons I decided to attend FOH this year (besides the fact that it's in Denver, while it is usually much further away.) The reason involves something called the "Narrative Lectionary." You might have heard me say before that I typically select the texts upon which I preach from something called a "lectionary", that is, a list of portions of the Bible appointed to be read at a church service for each day or week of the year. You might not know that there are many lectionaries. I have tended to use one called the Revised Common Lectionary (RCL). The RCL is based on the idea that we should hear from the voice of one of the gospel writers roughly every week for a year (with breaks being taken based on the seasons/holidays of the Christian year) instead of hearing discrete texts based on different themes each week.


Well, I've been doing that here at FCCGJ for the past 3 years, and the RCL is on a 3-year cycle, so I've been looking at the possibility of selecting a different lectionary for the next 3-4 years. At FOH this week, I will be attending several lectures and workshops about the Narrative lectionary, a 4-year lectionary that attempts to "follow the sweep of the Biblical story, from Creation through the early Christian church."

Keep watch for a future newsletter article that will provide more information about what I learn about the Narrative Lectionary and whether or not we'll begin using it. If we do, we will likely begin in September, since the Narrative Lectionary is set on a September through May schedule, with a break over the summer months for sermon series. — Pastor Brad



Mary Todd Lincoln's dressmaker was Elizabeth Kecklev who was self-educated and an excellent seamstress. Keckley had been a slave but was also Mrs. Lincoln's best friend. The book gives us an opportunity to read about happenings within the White House during Lincoln's presidency and his wife's tormented life after his assassination. This book included much information taken from the book written by Elizabeth Keckley herself which is already being circulated and available as well--very informative.




