

## Your Christian Identity and Politics (Part 3): Keep the Dialog Going

Disclaimer: If, by this title, you are expecting that I'm going to tell you who to vote for or even what to think about specific issues, please know that I will do neither. If, as you read this, you feel like I'm telling you who to vote for or what to think about a specific issue, please re-read what you just read...because that's not what this article is about.

I remember sitting down to my first men's breakfast at a congregation I served long ago. I noticed a group of guys sitting at one end of the very long table and a group of guys sitting at the other end. There were several empty seats in between each group of guys. I was very happy at my good fortune: I could sit in the middle of the table, where I could talk to the most people! It didn't take long to learn that I was wrong about this being good fortune. From one end of the table, guys chided me for sitting too close to the Republican men of the congregation. From the other end of the table, guys chided me for sitting too close to the Democratic men of the congregation. From each end, I was told I had to choose to side with one group or the other; I was not permitted to sit in the middle.

For the rest of the time I served that congregation, I noticed there was no real dialog that crossed the gap between those two groups of men. There was no real dialog on Saturday mornings at men's breakfast or any other time. Any time - even on Sunday morning - a conversation arose that had anything to do with politics, someone from one of the two groups would shut it down with name calling or a raised voice.

I realized at that moment that we (in that congregation) had forgotten something very important the Apostle Paul taught us: as Christians, our affiliation is through Jesus, not through anything else. "There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus." - Galatians 3:38

The world will try to tell us something different. In fact, I just watched a news segment about how people like to form an identity as being part of a group and that political affiliation offers one of the strongest group identities. This election year and always, I would like to remind you that our strongest group affiliation should be our affiliation with our brothers and sisters in Christ. To that end, we should seek not to cut off dialog when topics evoking strong opinions arise in conversation but should instead seek to discover how our affiliation as followers of Jesus can lead to a civil discourse in which we all seek to discover what Christ most wants for us and from us. It really shouldn't matter what the Republican Party says we should want or what the Democratic Party says we should want. As Christians, what should matter is what we discern Jesus would want.



Please mark your calendars and plan to be here for this very important meeting.


As you know, our region, the Central Rocky Mountain Region of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), has been without a settled Executive Regional Minister since Rev. José Gonzalez departed to pursue a Ph.D. in California. We have been led by Interim Executive Regional Minister, Rev. Dean Phelps, who has been doing a great job but has not been called to his position indefinitely.

In 2015, the Region's Executive Committee approved the appointment an Executive Regional Minister Search Team to lead the process of finding the right person to call into the position of Executive Regional Minister. The Team is in the process of meeting throughout the Region in an effort to listen to members of congregations as a way of preparing a profile of who our Region is and what our Region desires from our future Executive Regional Minister.
