

Responding to Tragedy: An Invitation to Action

One of my favorite aspects of God's interaction with people as found in the scriptures is God's invitation to action. When God saw a world full of violence in the Old Testament times, God called a people to act in a different way, a more loving way, than all the other peoples. God called Moses to gather the people together and invite them into a covenant to act in a better way. When God's people strayed, God spoke through prophets to remind the people to act in a better way, to be a "light to the world" (Isaiah 49.) And God sent Jesus to teach all people to act in the better way of love, the way God had commanded God's people in days of old, to "love your neighbor as yourself" (Leviticus 19:18, Matthew 22:39).

What word does God offer us in the midst of acts of violence in our nation? What word does God offer us in the midst of hatred and tension among varying groups within our nation (and our world)?

God offers more than a single word, for sure. There are words of comfort, reminders that God is with us in the midst of pain and strife. There are words of guidance away from anger and hatred and toward unity in the midst of division.

So there are multiple words from God, but one that I feel gets overlooked too often is God's call to action. Just as God called God's people in the Old Testament to act in ways that shine light into the world, God calls US to act in ways that shine light into the world. We are not mere passengers in life; we are participants. Even when the anger, hatred, and acts of violence seem to be thousands of miles away in Louisiana, Minnesota, Ohio, Missouri, New York, Florida, or Texas, God calls us to action here in Grand Junction. God calls us to act in the ways of love. We can respond to God's call to act with words, for sure, but not words alone, and we most certainly should not confine our response to words of complaint or hatred or anger. No, God call us to orient our words toward solutions and compassion. And God calls us to back our words with actions of love, to do our part to show that in Christ there is no place for division, in Christ there is no place for discrimination, in Christ there is no place for oppression or abuse.

I was inspired by the Dallas police chief who called on protesters to do more than protest, who called on protesters to act by becoming police officers themselves and working to end the injustices they're protesting. When we act to end injustice *in addition to* speaking out against it, then we truly participate.

I encourage all of you to consider how God is calling you to reach through the barriers that divide our country with actions of unity, actions of love, and actions of peace. You can make a difference. Indeed, God is calling you to make a difference.

Sunday School





El Salvador Update

DeeAnn and Clayton Lowry, and John and I are eagerly looking forward to our August mission trip to El Salvador. Because there are four from our church, and twelve all together, we are hoping to pack some suitcases full of needed supplies to take to the adults and children in the impoverished area we will be working in. We need basic medical supplies--especially pain relievers and vitamins (childrens, prenatal or multi vitamins for adults). They always need first aid supplies such as bandages, Neosporin, etc. We also always use paintbrushes or rollers. Those things can get heavy so money to buy them when we are there is a way to go also.

We will be working near two schools so can always use basic school supplies. We also work at a preschool so some appropriate things for little ones would be helpful. Barnes and Nobles has Spanish language books. Remember these children know no English so books in English aren't much fun for them. Crayons, scissors, that kind of thing is great.

We will be building two houses while we are there. A generous person from Oklahoma is donating the money for one of them. That leaves fundraisers and donations for the approximately \$3,000 we need to build the other one. Please, please attend the fundraising dinner we are having on July 23 at 5:00 with the silent auction. The dinner will be free with donations accepted for the food itself. The silent auction will have many Salvadoran items to bid on as well as general merchandise. It is always fun to come and see what is available.

Even if you can't attend the dinner, we will be accepting cash donations. Please let me, or the Lowry's know where you want the money to go. We are building a new home for an older couple who live in appalling conditions, sleeping on feed sacks that they move around their dirt floor house depending on the way the wind blows the rain on the leaky roof. We want to build them a dry, weather-proof home and buy them a bed.

Probably our biggest need is money to take for the homes and the needs we see when we are there. Your generosity has always overwhelmed me. We are a famous church in the little village of Las Trincheras.

Update from the FCC – Grand Junction Board Meeting - June 12, 2016

The Board of FCC-GJ met at 4pm on June 12, 2016. A quorum was present. Meeting was opened with prayer by Pam Baumgartle, moderator. Minutes from the November 15, 2015 meeting were provided and approved as amended. (A copy of the minutes may be obtained from Linda Edwards, secretary).

The following departments provided a brief update on their work since January 1, 2016:

Outreach; Worship; Education; Stewardship; Technology; Property; Evangelism and CWF.

Not present were Membership and Men's Fellowship

Stewardship reported as of May 31, 2016 the Church is in a positive position and has net income of \$853. Stewardship stated this is a continued improvement from prior years. 2015 significantly improved from 2014 and 2016 continues to show improvement from 2015. Good news.

The Board approved the nominating committee for 2017:

Les Armbruster; Al Baumgartle; Dennis Edwards; Linda Edwards; Ann Hutton; Jim Matthews The committee provides representation from both services and the men's fellowship and CWF.

CWF president Lily Fitch requested that Property Department approve the purchase and installation of a new toilet in the women's hall bathroom. All cost to be covered by CWF. Property approved. The Moderator informed the Board that committees will soon be working on revising the church by-laws and on long-range planning for capital projects.

The Board discussed evangelism and church growth. The Board unanimously agreed that these are of vital importance to the church. A message for the congregation will be placed in the Crosswords. Discussion was also held concerning a possible change in the wording of our mission that is presented in the bulletin on Sundays. The wording will be changed to: Praising God, Changing Lives! Pastor Brad provided information on his activities as well as an update on the progress of the Sunday evening service. The Pastor's family has committed to evangelism and growth by starting this evening service and inviting people who normally do not attend a church service. The evening service is considerably different from our other two services and provides the opportunity expand our ministry to those who may not enjoy a more traditional service. Pastor Brad asked for continued prayers for the new service and for evangelism in general. The Board thanked Pastor Brad and his family for committing to this endeavor.
