

My 3-Month Sabbatical Begins April 2, 2018

If you didn't yet know I am going to be taking a 3-month sabbatical this year, the above article title probably surprised you. If it did, that's ok, as long as it led you to read this article. At our Cabinet meeting Sunday night, the Cabinet urged me to begin talking about my sabbatical with frequency between now and April 2 (the day after Easter this year), so no one will be surprised when I'm not reachable between April 2 and July 2.

What is a Sabbatical?

The website "Soul Shepherding" defines a sabbatical as:

...a season of Sabbath for prolonged rest. It's an extended time in which you do no work. You do no pastoring, no leading, no ministering. You don't try to accomplish anything big. You just "do nothing"!

This idea of sabbatical as prolonged rest (from leading) for pastors is based on the spirit of biblical Sabbath rest. If God proclaimed resting to be a good thing, it must be.

Why 3 Months, and Why Now?

The straightforward answer to both of these questions is that it's in my Letter of Call and contract with FCCGJ. After 5 years of service, I receive 3 months of Sabbatical time to refresh and recharge for continued leadership in ministry to the congregation.

What Will I be Doing?

A sabbatical is not an extended vacation but rather a time to rest and refresh for ministry, so that's exactly what I intend to do. I have a week-long retreat in the mountains scheduled beginning April 2, as well as some time to reconnect with my family (it's more difficult to do than you can imagine when you're on call 24/7). I'll also be studying a book about environmental stewardship and learning some practical skills to help in that endeavor.

What You Can Do

Keep supporting the ministries of FCCGJ while I'm away. Pray for me. Study the book I'll be studying (opportunities will be available.) And, most importantly, trust in, pray for, and call the leaders (Pastor Melanie, the Elders, and the Cabinet) who will be assuming my responsibilities while I'm away.




