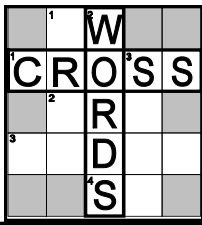

## Valentine's Day: Why We Should Care

I woke up this morning (Valentine's Day), sat down with my computer, and perused recent news (probably a bad idea.) The first article that caught my attention had to do with Valentine's Day. Well, ostensibly it was about Valentine's Day, which is why I clicked on it to read it, but it was really a political hit-piece against the person/people allegedly responsible for the loss of romance among American adults in 2019.

Which got me thinking...why do we celebrate Valentine's Day? Or rather, why did we start having a day named after St. Valentine, and why should we care and celebrate it today (as followers of Jesus)?

I wish I had space to fully share all the theories about St. Valentine with you, but I don't. I'll give you a summary of several of the most prominent:

- Valentine was either a priest of Rome, the Bishop of (what is now) Terni, Italy, or a Christian in the Roman province of Africa, who was martyred during the reign of Claudius II, likely in 269.
- Various accounts have Valentine successfully praying for God to restore the eyesight of his jailer's daughter or adopted daughter.
- In one account, Valentine attempted to convert the Roman emperor, which was the cause of his martyrdom. In variations of this account, prior to his execution Valentine wrote a note to the emperor's daughter and signed it, "Your Valentine."
- In another account, Valentine was executed for performing Christian weddings for couples, so the husbands would not have to go off to war for the emperor. To remind these couples of their vows, Valentine reportedly gave them hearts cut from parchment.

Why don't we know for sure? Apparently, there were at least three different early St. Valentines who were martyred on February 14.

Why should we care? As you can see, St. Valentine's life was significantly more about uplifting Christ and sharing the love of Christ than he was about romantic love. I'm not suggesting we should stop engaging in the romantic aspects of Valentine's Day as a cultural thing. Rather, I am suggesting we also think about this day as a reminder to share the love of Christ above everything else. St. Valentine gave his life to advance the cause of Jesus. That's what we should be predominantly thinking about on this day.

# Welcome

## Welcome, Adele Matera

Adele was born in Steger, IL, just south of Chicago where she lived for two years until, during WWII, her father joined the military and started his military career in the Air Force. During her childhood Adele's father's career took them to Cheyenne, WY; Colorado Springs, CO; Riverside, CA; Wiesbaden, Germany; Suitland, MD and Belton, MO. While in Colorado Springs, her parents bought a small chicken farm and Adele spent many Saturdays cleaning and prepping chickens for sale with her family. Chicken is not her favorite food to this day! After moving to Belton, MO, she met Larry Matera on a blind date.

Larry and Adele were married in Belton and six months later moved to Chicago where Larry worked for the Social Security Administration. Adele had graduated from Business School in Kansas City, MO, and worked for a Credit Union. After moving to Chicago Adele worked as the assistant to the Comptroller for the Central Accounting Office of Sears. After one and a half years they relocated to Suitland, MD, and Larry took a job for the Department of Defense at Andrews Air Force Base where their daughter Cindy was born. While in Maryland Larry accepted a position in the Foreign Service with the Department of State in Washington, DC, and Larry and Adele served overseas for 14 years. Their second daughter Dawn was born at their first posting in Paris, France, then their son Kevin was born at their second posting in Bangkok, Thailand before they went to the little country of Dohomey in West Africa which is now called Benin. (Dahomey means "Home of Dan" their first king—it's just west of Nigeria.) They were at Tehran, Iran, leaving there just before the Shah was deposed and the Embassy was taken hostage in the 1970s; their next assignment was La Paz, Bolivia; and their final assignment was San Jose, Costa Rica; before returning to the Department of State in Washington, DC, where Larry continued his service as a security and communications officer. She and her husband brought their children up in a Christian home and were especially involved with the missionaries in Thailand and West Africa (where they helped establish a church that Adele says had 30 members by the time they left), and Costa Rica.

After returning to the states Adele earned her degree as a registered nurse and worked in nursing for two years but due to health issues she returned to work in the business world.

After Larry retired he continued to work as a contractor for the State Department for two years until 1989 when they moved to Denver and began retirement life. In 2000 Larry became ill with myelodysplasia of the bone marrow. While on vacation in British Columbia, Larry felt so much better that they decided to move to Blaine, Washington, near the Canadian border where they lived for three years. During a 2004 visit to Adele's sister in Florida, Larry's disease turned into Acute Leukemia, and he passed away there in February 9, 2005.

While living in Denver before Larry's illness, Adele worked for the Colorado Chapter of the National MS Society for seven years as their director of finance and administration. Longing for a smaller city, Adele found Grand Junction to her liking and had a home built for her here. She arrived last August, came to church and transferred her membership in December. She is eager to get involved and has already joined two CWF groups, FCC Bookworms, helped with Christmas Eve services and plays Mexican Train.

Welcome, Adele. We are so excited to have you join us.

While working with people, near the end of life, it has become increasingly clear to me that people are forgetting how to tell stories and people do not seem to know how to listen to stories. I want to change that! I thought that, we as a church, could begin writing our own stories. What I plan to do is include 2 questions per newsletter (which would equate to one question per week for a year) that invite you to talk about yourself and your life. Take time to write down your answers in a journal (I don't really care that your handwriting doesn't look like it used to.....if we all used that excuse then none of us would be writing!) or type out your stories or ask someone from church to help you record your stories if you have no other way to express them! The important thing is that you take time to share your answers, your stories! It is my hope that we will have opportunities throughout the year to gather together and share our stories with one another, and in the end we can determine the best way to compile your stories into a book that can be shared with your friends and family! The truth is that we all have a story to tell.

God wants to use each of us, regardless of our age, and maybe just maybe by sharing our stories we will once again listen and learn how God is calling us and we will be able to encourage others as they share their stories!

Week 1: What is your birth story? (What stories were you told about your birth or what did you have to piece together through the years?)

What was the town/state in which you were born? What type of building were you born in?)

Week 2: Who are your birth and/or adoptive parents? (Do you know much about them or were they quiet and didn't speak much? Do you know anything about how they decided upon having children? What type of work did they do?)

3. How did you get your name? Are you named after someone? Do you like your name? Did you ever want a different name? If so, what/why?

4. Do you have siblings? If so, where do you fall into the birth order? Are you close to any/all of your siblings? How are you alike/different?
