

# Crucifixion: What Does it Mean to You that Jesus Died?

"Then Jesus cried again with a loud voice and breathed his last."

- Matthew 27:50

Jesus died. You know. I know it. We all know it, right?

When I was in a theology class in seminary, a professor made the claim that modern Western Christianity has emphasized resurrection over crucifixion, Easter over Good Friday, and he suggested we, as people studying to be pastors, consider whether or not that emphasis is problematic.

When I heard his suggestion, I disagreed internally. The image of a cross, the very symbol of modern Western Christian faith, flashed before my mind's eye, and I resisted the notion that we emphasize resurrection over crucifixion. Even so, the more I thought about it, and the more I have lived as a member of multiple Christian congregations since seminary, I've come to notice some things:

- Easter worship services are big deals, with an Easter worship service typically being one of the best attended worship services of the year. At the same time, crucifixion services (Good Friday or tenebrae worship) are attended so poorly that many congregations, ours included, don't even offer them anymore.
- I hear a great many people proclaim that resurrection is what saves us, that God's victory over death through Jesus on Easter Sunday provides our victory over death. However, the Bible reveals something quite different; Jesus' righteousness took the place of our (lack of) righteousness when Jesus died on that cross, so we can stand as righteous before God.
- I even hear some modern Christians lament that we talk about Jesus' death as necessary or important at all. They question what kind of God would require a death to make us righteous, and they don't want to know such a God. But this is nothing new; Docetism, a heresy dating back to the first century, denies Jesus' crucifixion. Still other groups claim one of Jesus' brothers was actually crucified and that Jesus escaped (apparently to Japan.)

OK. On to my point. Jesus died. When Jesus died, something important happened. While we may gloss over it from time to time because crucifixion is painful to spend time thinking about, even because we're inclined to think we'd prefer a God who didn't require crucifixion, Jesus' crucifixion matters. Over the coming week (through Good Friday), I encourage you to spend some extra time considering (and even talking with members of your church family about) what Jesus' crucifixion means to you.

## From you Elder Chair:

Hi church family. We have a great group of elders this year, who are working alongside the pastoral staff to make sure that we meet the growing needs of our congregation. As many of you know, but probably not all, the Bible sets forth why the church has elders and deacons and it was because there needed to be a division of responsibility in the church. There was too much work falling upon a particular group of people, so tasks were divvied up and the goal was to try to help ministry become more effective. Fast forward to today and we also are supposed to have some division of responsibility, but sometimes people, being people, want the pastor to do everything. (This mind set has existed in every church I've ever been a part of and actually the disciples argued over who would get to sit at Jesus' side. We want to be noticed. We want to be recognized. We want to be remembered.) Your pastors; however, can not do all the tasks of the church. They do not have crystal balls and they do not know when you need to be called or visited etc. They can not lead every ministry you want them to lead. They can not attend every committee meeting. Our pastors are professionals who have been called to ministry.....a prophetic task. All that said, please know that we (your elders) are working hard to try to meet the various spiritual needs that we are aware of; however, we can only do what we are aware of, so please call an elder if you have an elder request. If you have a pastor request, then please call a pastor. (And, just to clarify, telling me is not the same as telling Brad.) Pastor Brad's cell phone is on every bulletin, and he will return calls as soon as possible. (Sometimes he intentionally does not answer his phone because his wife enforces cell phone sabbath.) Pastor Melanie is also very accessible. We are all in this together. If we truly want to follow in the way of Jesus, then we need to place Jesus at the center of our thoughts and prayers and conversations. I have found that when I truly listen to Jesus then my words are more moderated and I act in more grace toward others, because as Pastor Brad said in his sermon this past week, "God is a God of grace. He extends grace to all who will receive it." Are you open to receiving God's grace? Does your life represent a life of grace? If not, then come speak to me or another elder or to one of your pastors because we want you to enjoy the grace that God offers to you, today and every day.

"As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord." Joshua 24:15




