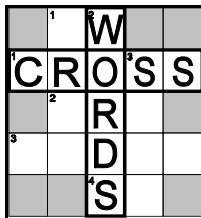

## Faith Talk:

### Who Cannot Be a Christian (Part 2)?

[This is the second in my summertime series called "Faith Talk". Each article in the series will provide probing questions and commentary about issues important to faith about which non-churched people you encounter might be curious.]

Today's topic: Who cannot be a Christian?

In my last article, I proposed that some Christians create boundaries around who can be a Christian; I even told a story about one (of many) time when some people told me I didn't meet their requirements. In that article, I addressed the answer from the perspective of people and told you that in my next article - THIS article - I would do my best address the question from the perspective of God as revealed in the scriptures. Following is my attempt to do just that.

I'll start with Jesus. To me, He would seem to be God's authority on the matter. Unfortunately, Jesus seems to have been rather unclear on the issue, having provided no direct statement. I can't find any examples of Jesus directly excluding anyone from being a Christian. Even so, He did say some things that might shed light on this matter:

- When Jesus called His disciples, he told them to "follow" Him. Does this mean anyone who "follows" Jesus is/can be a Christian? But, what does it mean to "follow" Jesus?
- At one point (see Matthew 10:34-37), Jesus indicated that anyone who loves biological family members (even parents and children) more than Jesus is "not worthy of" Jesus. Does this mean such people cannot be Christians?
- Also in Matthew 10 (verse 38), Jesus said that "whoever does not take up the cross and follow [Him] is not worthy of [Him]." Does this mean we must carry a cross to be a Christian? And is this a literal or metaphorical cross?
- At another point (Matthew 19:16-22), Jesus told a man to sell his possessions and give money to the poor and THEN follow Jesus. Does this mean we must sell all our possessions and give the proceeds to the poor before we can become Christians?

- Jesus told his disciples to do and not do so many other things: don't be hypocritical, fish for people, make disciples, baptize people, teach everything Jesus taught, and, of course, love God and love people. Does this mean we must do all these things, perfectly, in order to be Christians?
- And then, of course, we must remember that Jesus went to sinners and asked THEM to follow Him. He even said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick; I have come to call not the righteous but sinners" (Mark 2:17). Does this mean ANYONE can become a Christian?
- Finally, Jesus said some things about blaspheming the Holy Spirit (Mark 3:28-29) and how people who do this will not be forgiven. But, what does it mean to blaspheme the Holy Spirit, and is exclusion from salvation/forgiveness the same as exclusion from being a Christian?

It seems I've run out of space, so, next time, I'll continue with a Part 3. In part 3, I'll consider what the Apostle Paul had to say on the subject.

I look forward to hearing your thoughts about this!

# WELCOME

Betty Nelson has been attending FCC for several years, and on June 2<sup>nd</sup> she joined the church. Betty lives two doors from our house, so I have known her since 1973 when I moved onto Gummere Rd. She and her husband Carl and five children moved from Pennsylvania in 1970 to Gummere Road., and she has lived on this cul-de-sac longer than any of our other neighbors.

Betty was born on April 27, 1934, on her parents' 100-acre farm in Cumberland County, Pennsylvania, and is the sixth of fifteen children. Betty has milked a lot of cows and she helped work the farm where they grew their own food. She loved to ride the work horses and when she was about 15 or 16 her father bought for \$50 a beautiful white mare they called Cotton, and Betty was the only one she allowed to climb onto her back.

Whenever anyone asked Betty to help do something, she did, and became the favorite of her aunt and uncle who attended a Mennonite Church. They took her to church with them, and she was the only one in her family who attended church.

Before she graduated from high school the family moved to town and one night while walking home from the movie, Carl kept driving around the block so he could talk to her as he went by. They were married the following year at the Methodist Church in Holly, Pennsylvania. Carl was a barber and Betty worked for a company making crystals for engines used in spacecraft. They had their five children Kurt, Robin, Lori, Wade and Rex before leaving PA for GJ. Carl was a well known carpenter in town and built several homes throughout the valley. Betty worked a number of years for Coors Porcelain before becoming head cook at Wingate Elementary where they prepared meals for Wingate, Scenic and Broadway schools. Betty says the best part of being a cook was seeing and interacting with the children who called her Grandma.

In 2010 Betty had a stroke that has left her unable to use her left side; however, with much rehab and constant encouragement from her husband, she is still mobile for which she is grateful. Carl became quite ill and passed in 2011. She also lost her son Wade last year. Most of her family lives in the valley, and on holidays many of them congregate at Betty's home. There are 21 grandchildren, 16 great-grandchildren, some of which she acquired through her children's marriages. Betty says the hardest part of moving from Pennsylvania to Colorado was the dry air and the need to irrigate, but she says Colorado is her home now and would not want to move back to the East Coast.

We are pleased to welcome Betty into our FCC (DOC) membership.

### What is a Re-Use Room?

When I lived in St. Charles, MO, I fell in love with a place called Leftovers. (They have since moved to a new location in St. Louis. You should check out their website: <http://www.leftoversetc.com>). I have always dreamed of doing something on a smaller scale at a church. The idea is that we, church members, collect items that we imagine others might re-use. For example, I collect jars and cans and milk jugs and wine bottles etc. I have already had a friend ask for a specific size jar, which I was able to help her with and we were able to help a local friend with a project for which she needed wine bottles. Maybe we could get a group together to make items from our collected goods and then sell those things at the DWM bazaar in the fall. Maybe we could partner with a local school (like West Middle school) and the teachers could come check out what we have so they can use the things for kid's art projects or science projects. Maybe you just need a specific size jar or can for you own use! I don't know, but I do know that it is exciting to recycle and re-use. I do know that it is good for the environment. I do know that we are called to be good stewards of ALL that God has given us. So, stop by our Re-Use Room, that is located to the right of our church Library. ---

The London Marathon was held April 29 and they used 216,000 fewer plastic water bottles this year. How did they do it? When runners reached mile 23 they were handed Ooho capsules which are edible pods of seaweed extracts made by a London-based startup called Skipping Rocks Lab. If for some reason the pod is not eaten, it will biodegrade within six weeks, whereas a plastic bottle takes up to 450 years or more.

It takes more than five liters of water to produce a standard 500 ml plastic bottle according to an advocacy group Water Footprint Network.

---

According to a 2017 study published in the journal Science Advances, only 9 percent of 8,300 million metric tons of plastic ever produced has been recycled. Another 12 percent has been burned in incinerators. The remaining 79 percent has been sent to landfills, improperly discarded or found its way in to the oceans.

Earthworks System in Solon, Ohio can recycle scrap polymeric material, and that is what gift cards are made of. A box for plastic cards is on the Creation Care table in the Fellowship Hall. You can recycle: ID cards, credit cards, driver's licenses library cards, video rental cards, membership cards, shopper discount cards, retail gift cards ... One more way to clean up our waste. Earthworks will take the cards and make new cards which reduces the need for new PVC.
