

#### On Being Church and the Christmas Bazaar


• After the Board Meeting on Sunday, I helped some others who were in the building setting up tables and chairs...and talking about how some others would be arriving later in the day to help move things from storage to the building. And then, all during this week, the building is FILLED with people, working together, BEING together, like a family. "All who believed were together." • On Sunday, while working, I was offered a bowl of chili. On Monday, when I returned from lunch, a group of women were eating together around a table, resting after a hard morning of work, sharing food and stories. "They devoted themselves...to the breaking of bread..." "...They...ate their food with glad and generous hearts."

• Each day this week, I've seen the number of donated used and hand-crafted items grow, each item given with care by a member or friend of this congregation to be used for outreach, for lovingly helping people, for God's work. "...They would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need."

Friends, I know the Bazaar is hard work. I know we're aging as a congregation, and the work becomes more difficult with each passing year. At the same time, I am confident that I am witnessing First Christian Church, Grand Junction, truly BE church as much, if not more, than ever, as I watch you all work together to serve God in the week leading up to the annual CWF Christmas Bazaar! This amazing vision for Church, for congregation, you are living proof that it can be realized in the 21st century. Let's keep it going!



Bonnie Watts joined our church this past summer, and we welcome her into our congregation. She was born in Salida but her family moved to Georgetown when she was eleven. She has two brothers and a sister, and her mother still lives in Georgetown. After graduation from high school Bonnie went to Westminster College in Salt Lake City and received her degree in history and education in 1978.

After graduation Bonnie had a wide range of jobs which included driving school buses for the school district in Georgetown, working on construction crews, driving snow plows on I-70 and clerking in ski shops. She then got a job as a paralegal in Idaho Springs for an attorney in general practice as well as handling some divorce and estate cases. In order to continue in her job, she went to night school four nights a week for nine months to become certified. She worked for that attorney 12 years until his retirement. She continued free lancing as a paralegal working in Denver, Summit County and Idaho Springs until she moved to Montrose in 2002 where she became a screener at the Montrose airport. In 2007 she transferred to Telluride, and in 2011 she applied for an administrative position with the TSA in Grand Junction and feels fortunate to have been awarded the job.

Exotic birds are Bonnie's passion, and she has three birds. Zeus is her blue and gold macaw, 22 years old, and he has been with her for 20 years. She also has two African grays. She has hand raised Eno from a chick, and he is now 14 years old. Her other gray, Tory, came to live with her after her friend died.

Next to dogs and cats, birds are the most popular pet. Both dogs and cats are domesticated, but birds are still a wild animal and require much care and attention. Bonnie devotes a great amount of her free time to their well being. She says it is nice to have them greet her when she comes home. She and a few other fellow bird lovers created an on-line group that started providing items required for the support of birds that have been taken from an unsafe environment. Their Facebook group has grown to 4,000 participants who donate money for toys, food and maintenance; and this past year the group donated over \$50,000 which was matched by various companies to support these abused birds.

Lily Fitch invited Bonnie to visit us, and she has recently agreed to accept the position of Vice-President of our CWF ladies group. We are pleased to have Bonnie as part of our congregation.
