Transitioning Out of "Stay at Home" For First Christian Church, Grand Junction

By now, you've probably heard that the governor of Colorado, Jared Polis, has implemented a transition phase out of Colorado's "Stay at Home" order (which expired this past Monday.) You're likely wondering what these changes mean for FCCGJ. I'd like to address this question as best I can.

First, some background. Last week, I, along with thousands of others, attended a Faith Leaders' phone call with Governor Polis to hear his explanation of what this transition means specifically for congregations, to ask questions and listen to his answers, and to hear directly from Governor Polis what he anticipates will happen moving forward. What I heard from Governor Polis on this call - along with an ensuing meeting with the FCCGJ Executive Committee on Sunday - provides the knowledge that undergirds what I am about to explain.

Here's what I understand from Governor Polis that most pertains to FCCGJ:

• Through at least the month of May, no gatherings of more than 10 people, including worship gatherings.

• Governor Polis will evaluate the impact of this transition on the healthcare system at the end of May to determine whether to move to the next phase of the transition (which would allow gatherings of >10 people with certain limitations), to stay in the current phase (called "Safer at Home"), or even to move back to "Stay at Home".

• Throughout the current phase and the planned next phase (called "Protect Your Neighbors"), Governor Polis strongly encourages people in high risk categories, including everyone age 70+, to stay at home.

And here is what I understand from the FCCGJ Executive Committee:

- Corporate worship at the church building has been suspended through the end of May.
- The Committee is willing to allow small gatherings of people within the church building, as long as social distancing within these

• The Committee is encouraging the pastoral staff to provide more opportunities to stay connected and to feel like we're worshipping together (even if/when we're not.) In keeping with this effort, we will be working on a way to allow <=10 people to sign up for a gathering to watch a video of each Sunday's sermon at the church building. This option is intended for people who will not be able to watch sermons via YouTube (something that will be made available beginning this Sunday) or who live alone and are in the greatest need of social contact (even while "distancing".) Look for more information coming soon.

Things are looking up. We will be able to do more in the coming month than we've been able to do in the past $1-\frac{1}{2}$ months. Be hopeful, and be safe!

-God Sighting in Stressful Times-

As we continue to live within this Covid-19 stay-at-home story, I have been reading a little about WW2 and some of the folks who were there. It's interesting to contrast the current crisis with the impact a world war had on the country and how people tend to react in stressful times such as we experience today.

As I was reading (and thinking about "God sightings"), I was reminded of a story Ben Carnes once told me. For those who have never met him, Ben and his wife were very active members of our church around the time our current church building was constructed. In looking through old church documents it is apparent he and Harold Moss were some of the primary movers and shakers of church financial activities.

For background, just a few weeks after his 18th birthday, Ben enlisted in the Army Air Corps. and was assigned to the 15th Army Air Force, 2nd Bomb Group, 20th Squadron in

Italy. The primary objective of the 15th was to turn off the supply of oil to the Axis forces by bombing refineries and factories in Axis occupied countries. Before he celebrated his next birthday, Ben had flown 19 bombing missions.

As part of this undertaking, the B17 bomber in which Ben was a bombardier was assigned to participate in a bombing mission to destroy a refinery south of Berlin that manufactured fuel for the Messerschmitt 262, the first German jet powered aircraft.

A story I read in the Senior Beacon quoted Ben "Before we left, our commander said, 'Gentlemen, we don't expect any of you to come back'" "But the good God gave us a strong tailwind as we flew up the Adriatic Sea."

This then was Ben's story as I remember it. A few years ago, Ben attended a reunion of veterans who served with the 15th Army Air Corps. during the war. While there, he was approached by a man who asked if Ben had participated in the bombing of a specific refinery. Ben told him that he had, in fact, flown that very mission. The man went on to tell him that, at the time of the bombing, he was a prisoner of war in a POW camp located just beside the refinery. The Germans had the idea that locating the camp there might deter Allied forces from bombing the refinery and fuel dumps.

The man related that the prisoners in the camp knew the refinery was a primary bombing target. The day they heard the thunder of the bombers approaching, he said, they knew they would likely die when bombs fell. He went on to recount that, as the bombs began to explode, prisoners went out into the yard and joined together in prayer. He said, as the bombing continued, the explosions sent flames and smoke soaring thousand of feet into the sky. Although the prisoners definitely experienced the terrible intense heat and the tremendous concussion of the explosions, the prevailing winds blew the flames away from the camp and the prisoners were miraculously saved.

What a story of true God sightings on so many levels. A young man in a B17 bomber flying a mission from which he was not expected to return and a young man in a German prisoner of war camp expecting to die in the holocaust of a burning fuel refinery, both praying for themselves and their comrades, and then ... meeting each other, for the first time, more than 50 years later.

Thinking about this story and the impact WW 2 had on this country, and the whole world, puts our current situation into a different perspective. We emerged from the war a stronger and more faithful people, let us pray that this current crisis has the same effect.
