Updated Guidelines for Returning to the Church Building: Worship and More

Beginning this Sunday, May 31 (Pentecost Sunday), the church building will be open for worship gatherings again...after more than 2 months. We have not gathered together for corporate worship since March 8! As long as Mesa County remains relatively COVID-free, we will continue to offer more and more opportunities at the church building. For example, the staff will return to the church building for office hours next week, the Healthy Living Class has already returned to meetings at the church building, the Wednesday Evening Bible study will be held both at the church building and via Zoom each week, and more.

Even though we will begin gathering and worshipping at the church building again, things are not quite returning to normal - not yet and perhaps not ever (this pandemic will lead to some permanent societal changes, I imagine.) Most importantly, I and the FCCGJ Executive Committee continue to prioritize your health (physical, mental, spiritual - your whole health) above all else. With this in mind, please be aware of the following guidelines for returning to activity at the church building:

• Masks must be worn at all times in the church building. (Worshippers will not be admitted without a mask, but we will have some extra masks available for those who do not have or bring one.)

• **Worship Leadership** - For the near future, one person (typically Pastor Brad) will lead all spoken worship elements. We do this, so there will be only one person without a mask, and that person will be behind a plexiglass screen and very distant from the rest of the congregation.

• **Communion will be different.** The elements will not be distributed by deacons. Rather, some elements will be available on tables at the front of the sanctuary. **Worshippers are encouraged to bring their own communion elements from home.**

• **Music will be different.** Evidence suggests singing can spread the virus a greater distance than talking, even when masks or worn. As a result, we will show videos of songs and **encourage light/soft singing behind masks**. Please do not try to project your voice a great distance when singing.

• There will be no coffee mingle or other non-worship Sunday morning activities. Until we can figure out a way to have social distancing during coffee mingle or until it becomes safe (and legal) to not social distance, we will not have coffee mingle. Essentially, Sunday morning gatherings will be limited to worship only.

• There will be one entrance and one exit for Sundays. Please enter through the kitchen door and exit at the end of the north/education wing.

-God Sighting in Stressful Times-

As we continue to live within this Covid-19 stay-at-home story, I have been reading a little about WW2 and some of the folks who were there. It's interesting to contrast the current crisis with the impact a world war had on the country and how people tend to react in stressful times such as we experience today.

As I was reading (and thinking about "God sightings"), I was reminded of a story Ben Carnes once told me. For those who have never met him, Ben and his wife were very active members of our church around the time our current church building was constructed. In looking through old church documents it is apparent he and Harold Moss were some of the primary movers and shakers of church financial activities.

For background, just a few weeks after his 18th birthday, Ben enlisted in the Army Air Corps. and was assigned to the 15th Army Air Force, 2nd Bomb Group, 20th Squadron in Italy. The primary objective of the 15th was to turn off the supply of oil to the Axis forces by bombing refineries and factories in Axis occupied countries. Before he celebrated his next birthday, Ben had flown 19 bombing missions.

As part of this undertaking, the B17 bomber in which Ben was a bombardier was assigned to participate in a bombing mission to destroy a refinery south of Berlin that manufactured fuel for the Messerschmitt 262, the first German jet powered aircraft.

A story I read in the Senior Beacon quoted Ben "Before we left, our commander said, 'Gentlemen, we don't expect any of you to come back'" "But the good God gave us a strong tailwind as we flew up the Adriatic Sea."

This then was Ben's story as I remember it. A few years ago, Ben attended a reunion of veterans who served with the 15th Army Air Corps. during the war. While there, he was approached by a man who asked if Ben had participated in the bombing of a specific refinery. Ben told him that he had, in fact, flown that very mission. The man went on to tell him that, at the time of the bombing, he was a prisoner of war in a POW camp located just beside the refinery. The Germans had the idea that locating the camp there might deter Allied forces from bombing the refinery and fuel dumps.

The man related that the prisoners in the camp knew the refinery was a primary bombing target. The day they heard the thunder of the bombers approaching, he said, they knew they would likely die when bombs fell. He went on to recount that, as the bombs began to explode, prisoners went out into the yard and joined together in prayer. He said, as the bombing continued, the explosions sent flames and smoke soaring thousand of feet into the sky. Although the prisoners definitely experienced the terrible intense heat and the tremendous concussion of the explosions, the prevailing winds blew the flames away from the camp and the prisoners were miraculously saved.

What a story of true God sightings on so many levels. A young man in a B17 bomber flying a mission from which he was not expected to return and a young man in a German prisoner of war camp expecting to die in the holocaust of a burning fuel refinery, both praying for themselves and their comrades, and then ... meeting each other, for the first time, more than 50 years later.

Thinking about this story and the impact WW 2 had on this country, and the whole world, puts our current situation into a different perspective. We emerged from the war a stronger and more faithful people, let us pray that this current crisis has the same effect
