

A Vision From God to FCCGJ

On Sunday, August 30, I shared a God-sighting in worship. If you were there, please keep reading, as this article provides an important UPDATE to that God-sighting.

The God-Sighting:

Early Thursday morning (August 27), I awoke with full memory of a dream that was about FCCGJ. In the dream, a Christian women's group from the community - not our CWF - was looking for a new congregational home following COVID; their congregation didn't make it through the pandemic. And God directed that group to FCCGJ. The dream took place on a Sunday morning, the first Sunday morning this group and their family members - husbands, siblings, children, grandchildren - decided to worship here. The sanctuary was so packed we had to add chairs. And there was a buzz, an enthusiasm, as these new worshippers became acclimated to FCCGJ. I don't know that God was telling me that a group just like the one in my dream would soon be joining us, but I do know that dream was a God-sighting. I do know God was offering us hope through that dream, hope for prosperity on the other side of the COVID pandemic. And I very strongly experienced God urging me to share the dream with you during God sightings.

The UPDATE:

On Sunday, August 30, the day I shared this God-sighting, we had four visitors from Las Vegas worshipping with us. Two of them were a husband-and-wife ministry couple. They shared with me that they were passing through Grand Junction and allowed God to direct them where to worship; God directed them to FCCGJ. They told me that when they heard the God-sighting above, they received confirmation from God's Holy Spirit that something like what I described in my dream WILL happen here at FCCGJ after the pandemic. They said the new people God will send our way will bring change - likely in the form of greater ethinic diversity - but that God WILL send new people to FCCGJ following the resolution of the pandemic. They were very excited for us, even to the point of tears of joy!

Please keep this congregation in your prayers. Pray that we will have the strength to follow God's direction into the future God has planned for us!

This phrase, "Praising God", also describes our first response to the God we encounter. When we look to God, we are reminded of God's great love for us and all people shown throughout history, and our first response MUST be to praise. That's why we worship every Sunday, to praise God and set a pattern for praising God in our lives.

Changing Lives. Our second response to God is to change lives, which means to help other people. By "other people", we don't mean people within our congregation exclusively; rather, we mean all other people, especially other people in need. That's why so many of our ministries are focused on identifying needs and meeting them. A few examples include our Love-in-Action box, our commitment to Community Food Bank, our service at HomewardBound of the Grand Valley, our collection of school supplies, and our offering of a community garden to feed hungry people.

The past few months have been full of uncertainty, fear, anxiety, and unrest...however I find that our spiritual life has increased as we have turned more of our focus to God on a "daily" basis instead of only one day a week. When you have negative feelings, unrest, humans seem to focus on God more for the comfort and strength that we need.

First Christian Church, Grand Junction - compared to other churches in our region - is fairing ok financially even with thirty of our members attending worship regularly at the church building, many of you attending online, and it is unknown how many of you are reading the sermons each week and participating in worship on your own.

Even in the midst of the hardships of this pandemic, the congregation continues to send money to Disciples Mission Fund to help those in need all over the world. We continue to send funds to the Food Bank, Homeward Bound and the Tennyson Center. We still continue to do "Outreach".

Our ministers have been very busy inside and outside of the church. Pastor Brad and Pastor Melanie have been on the go as there are many of us that require their spiritual assistance during these uncertain times. They have also been working to adapt to the challenges of this time to provide opportunities to keep the congregation connect, providing daily reflections, producing YouTube sermons, leading Zoom Bible Studies, making many calls, making the building as safe as possible for gatherings at the building, and more.

It is important that I share with you that income for 2020, May, June and July, is down (\$6,528.58) compared to 2019 during the same period of time. Although expenses have dropped some due to the lack of use of the building there still remains some constant unchanged expenses.

With this said, Stewardship is asking that you keep the church in mind when processing your giving these summer months. Continue to connect with God on a daily basis and we look forward to the time when all of us will be together as a family again!

Week of Compassion: How Our Giving Meets The Needs of the World

In recent weeks, I've received questions about how the money we give to our Denomination's Week of Compassion ministry is getting used to meet the needs of the world, particularly amidst the COVID-19 pandemic.

If you are interested in learning as much as you can about Week of Compassion and what happens to your giving to Week of Compassion (WoC), I encourage you to visit the WoC website at www.weekofcompassion.org. The specific link for WoC's COVID-19 response is www.weekofcompassion.org/covid19response.html.

If you are looking for a summary of WoC's COVID-19 response, I'll provide one here.

Domestically, WoC provides two types of grants. Household Solidarity Grants for Income Loss provide financial assistance to households which have experienced extreme financial hardship due to the pandemic and are not eligible for state or federal aid. Congregational Solidarity Grants for Community Assistance provide financial support to congregational ministries focused on addressing food security.

Internationally, WoC supports existing WoC partners who have developed COVID-19-specific programs focused on meeting needs related to water, hygiene, sanitation, and food security.

Even though WoC is working diligently to meet needs related to the pandemic, the ministry continues to meet other needs, as well. One recent example is assistance to help communities that were devastated by the August 10 derecho that swept across the Upper Midwest of the US. Through WoC, your giving is helping provide food and charging stations to the hundreds of thousands of people impacted by the storm who are still awaiting governmental assistance.

Guidelines for Church Groups Seeking to Use the Church Building

It seems like the COVID-19 pandemic has been going on for a long time! At the FCCGJ Cabinet meeting on Sunday, July 26, the cabinet members discussed that it also feels like the COVID-19 pandemic will continue to impact our society, our daily lives, and our congregational life for the foreseeable future (likely at least until the end of 2020.)

Given the uncertainty about the future coupled with the desires of our congregational members to find ways to continue to meet and be connected as a congregation, the FCCGJ Cabinet created some guidelines for church members and groups who wish to use the church building for gathering opportunities while the pandemic continues. Here are the guidelines:

- #1 Yes, church members and church groups CAN use the church building outside of Sunday worship, as long as they adhere to the rest of these guidelines.
- #2 While in the church building, people from family groups (people you live with) must maintain social distancing of 6+ feet from people from other family groups.
- #3 While in the church building, masks/face coverings must be worn over the mouth and nose.
- #4 Only one person is allowed in each bathroom at a time.
- #5 All touched surfaces must be cleaned with appropriate cleaning supplies by the members of the group which meets prior to departing the building.
- #6 Please coordinate your gatherings at the church building with Tish in the church office.
- #7 If you're wondering, the Cabinet believes up to 25 people can be accommodated in the Fellowship Hall and up to 50 people in the sanctuary with proper social distancing. Other spaces are limited to 10 or fewer people.

Please call the church office if you have questions or to schedule a gathering.



I am writing to provide an update on Dorothy Rhodes, who resides at Grandview Care Lodge here in Grand Junction.

As you likely know, due to COVID-19, Dorothy has been able to have very limited contact with the world outside her residence; it's part of the reality of the rules being implemented to protect our most vulnerable citizens, including Dorothy.

Many of you have responded to Dorothy's predicament by sending her cards and making phone calls to help keep Dorothy connected. Dorothy has reached out to me through her daughter-in-law, Arlene, to express her gratitude - she is very thankful for your expressions of love and friendship - but also to make a request.

During the past 5 months (the lockdown), Dorothy's ability to communicate has deteriorated. She has difficulty hearing on the telephone, and she has difficulty writing cards and letters. She communicates best face-to-face, but she can only communicate face-to-face with a few people (who have just recently been granted face-to-face access to Dorothy.)

Given these changes, Dorothy asks the following: if you would like to communicate with Dorothy (cards, phone calls, anything really), please communicate through Arlene, who will then take your communication and provide it to Dorothy in a face-t0-face setting.




