

### We Are Living in Strange Times: What Are We to Do?

By now, you've probably seen the new bulletin insert about the cancellations and changes to many of our traditional/annual end of year ministries (due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic):

- No Trunk or Treat
- No Disciples Women Holiday Bazaar
- No Congregational Thanksgiving Sunday Meal
- No Community Thanksgiving Day Meal
- No Christmas Music Program
- A significant change to the way we participate in Operation Christmas Child

There are more changes than these. There will likely be changes to the way we decorate our church building for Christmas. There continue to be changes to our ability to meet regularly in fellowship. We have many fewer people who can safely venture to our building when we do gather. And, of course, we have already missed the opportunity to participate in Holy Week ministries as a congregation and to celebrate Christ's resurrection on Easter in communal worship. Changes abound.

As I tried to envision a word to describe these times, the word "strange" came to mind. "Strange" is defined as "unusual or surprising in a way that is unsettling or hard to understand." I would suggest the "unusual" and "unsettling" aspects of "strange" aptly apply to the year 2020.

What are we to do amidst such strange times as these? There are so many passages of scripture that provide the answer. One comes from God through the prophet Isaiah:

Do not fear, for I have redeemed you;

I have called you by name, you are mine.

When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you;

when you walk through fire you shall not be burned,

and the flame shall not consume you.

For I am the Lord your God,

the Holy One of Israel, your Savior. (Isaiah 43:2b-4)

In such times as these, God may not be doing what we want God to do. God may not be providing a vaccine or treatment as fast as we want. God may not be healing our friends and loved ones in the way that we want. God might not be doing anything that we want. However, God is with us. God will be with us. God will direct us into a better future, a better future on this earth and a better future for eternity with God. This is the hope we Christians should have/find in God that will strengthen us as we journey through this pandemic. It is my prayer that you find hope and strength in the God who journeys with us in these strange times!

This phrase, "Praising God", also describes our first response to the God we encounter. That's why we worship every Sunday, to praise God and set a pattern for praising God in our lives.

**Changing Lives.** Our second response to God is to change lives, which means to help other people. By "other people", we don't mean people within our congregation exclusively; rather, we mean all other people, especially other people in need. That's why so many of our ministries are focused on identifying needs and meeting them. A few examples include our Love-in-Action box, our commitment to Community Food Bank, our service at HomewardBound of the Grand Valley, our collection of school supplies, and our offering of a community garden to feed hungry people.




### The LOVE Fund Needs Your Help!

When people approach me with a need that can be met with a little financial help - often a need for food, household goods, clothing beyond what we have in the Outreach room, children's items, transportation, help with utilities, etc. - and I discern the need to be genuine, I use the LOVE Fund to help out. It's the quickest way I can access funds to meet these kinds of needs.

2019, the food bank served 16,000 people. So far this year they have served 21,000. Part of their process of providing food for those in need has changed. They now deliver to those in quarantine, and at-risk individuals. They have done 3,300 of these home-type deliveries in addition to those coming to the food bank. The article did have some good news. The Food Bank will be moving into permanent quarters after Thanksgiving and will be spending \$800 less per month than they have been on rent. From March through June they provided 100,000 more pounds of food! They do get much of their food from the Food Bank of the Rockies and local restaurants. However, as mentioned in the last Crosswords, they appreciate our much-needed monetary contributions as well as the quality of food we also collect for them. Their need is greater than ever. 
