

Advent 2020: "A Light Shines in the Darkness"

I bet you're struggling - at least a little bit - with the coming of Advent amidst this strange year that has been 2020 and the current worsening of the COVID-19 pandemic in the nation and especially around us in Mesa County:

- Maybe you're lamenting the cancellation for this year of some of your favorite ministries of FCCGJ;
- Maybe you're lamenting the cancellation or significant changes to whatever comprises your typical pre-Christmas activity schedule: Christmas parties, parades, Black Friday, get-togethers with friends, festive shopping and meal trips, etc.
- Maybe you're worried Christmas won't feel like Christmas if you must celebrate alone, or at least more alone and isolated than usual.
- Maybe you won't be able to travel to visit family and friends this year.

There's nothing wrong with worrying that Advent - the time of preparing for Jesus' birth/Christmas - won't be the same this year. While there's not much I can do about the reality of what is transpiring around us - the activities of Advent will NOT be the same this year, there might be something I can offer about the "worrying" part.

As it turns out, the way we modern Americans, even modern American Christians, tend to celebrate Advent isn't all that similar to what was going on during the original Advent. In fact, the original Advent - the period of time leading up to Jesus' birth - was likely quite a bit more like 2020 than like any other Advent during my lifetime. Remember God's words through the prophet Isaiah:

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness—on them light has shined.

Since we live in a time post-Jesus'-birth, it's usually quite difficult for us to associate Advent with darkness. We tend to focus more on the light which for us is in the past, not the future. For God's ancient people, the time of Advent was truly a time of darkness: God's people had been exiled from the Promised Land, and, even after they were allowed to return to the Promised Land, most of God's people chose to remain in exile and even away from the kind of relationship God desired with them. In that time, God's people understood darkness. In that time, God's people understood defeat, and they longed for a spiritual victory.

This year, as you mourn the loss of some of your typical Advent celebrations, rather than despairing, I encourage you to try to imagine yourself longing for God's light to shine in this darkness. Take your feelings of loss to God and ask God to show you how to look forward to God's light amidst this present darkness. That's what Advent is supposed to be about!

This phrase, "Praising God", also describes our first response to the God we encounter. When we look to God, we are reminded of God's great love for us and all people shown throughout history, and our first response MUST be to praise. That's why we worship every Sunday, to praise God and set a pattern for praising God in our lives.

Changing Lives. Our second response to God is to change lives, which means to help other people. By "other people", we don't mean people within our congregation exclusively; rather, we mean all other people, especially other people in need. That's why so many of our ministries are focused on identifying needs and meeting them. A few examples include our Love-in-Action box, our commitment to Community Food Bank, our service at HomewardBound of the Grand Valley, our collection of school supplies, and our offering of a community garden to feed hungry people.

2019, the food bank served 16,000 people. So far this year they have served 21,000. Part of their process of providing food for those in need has changed. They now deliver to those in quarantine, and at-risk individuals. They have done 3,300 of these home-type deliveries in addition to those coming to the food bank. The article did have some good news. The Food Bank will be moving into permanent quarters after Thanksgiving and will be spending \$800 less per month than they have been on rent. From March through June they provided 100,000 more pounds of food! They do get much of their food from the Food Bank of the Rockies and local restaurants. However, as mentioned in the last Crosswords, they appreciate our much-needed monetary contributions as well as the quality of food we also collect for them. Their need is greater than ever. Time to Start Making Preparations for Advent Home Worship!

Advent is near; it begins Sunday, November 29, 2020.

Some of you may choose to spend your Sunday morning worship time here at the church building...if the COVID situation in Mesa County improves enough to allow it. But, some of you will almost certainly be worshipping at home. Since Advent is a special time, and Advent worship will involve special elements, I want to give you the opportunity to start making plans for your Advent home worship.

Here are some things you will need for worshipping at home this Advent season:

- Hanging of the Greens elements. November 29 will be our Hanging of the Greens service. I encourage you to find elements around your house to use for this service. Examples include: garland/greenery, a wreath, holly and ivy, pictures that remind you of Advent (to take the place of "banners"), a nativity scene, and your family Christmas tree.
- Candles to represent your "Advent Wreath". Each Sunday, I will supply an Advent Candle Reading with instructions for lighting a candle. You could use one candle or up to five candles for your at-home "Advent wreath".
- A candle for Christmas Eve. Whether we have a Christmas Eve service at the church building or not (and whether you're able to attend or not), I will make a Christmas Eve service available for you to use at home that will include a singing of "Silent Night" with a lit candle. (I will try to have a "live" service broadcast via Zoom from the church building.) Be thinking about and finding the candle you would like to use.

It will take some creativity, but I encourage you to do what you can to make your Advent worship special amidst COVID this year!
