Celebrating Advent as a Church Family Amidst COVID-19

By now, you've likely heard the news: we at FCCGJ won't be able to get back to in-building corporate worship in time for the first Sunday of Advent - THIS Sunday, November 29, 2020.

We can - and should - lament what this means for us. At the same time, we've probably spent quite a bit of time lamenting what we cannot do these past 8-9 months. What I'd like to focus on in this article is what you/we CAN do to be God-focused together, especially in our worship, this Advent season. Here are some things you can do.

• Participate in a daily devotional and Advent calendar reading/ activity. By the time you read this - or shortly thereafter - you should have received an envelope in the mail that includes an Advent devotional book based on the Jesse Tree, a Jesse Tree Advent calendar, an instructional sheet, and a Chrismon. Please participate in the Advent Calendar activity daily! As you do, imagine others in your church family partaking of the same activity. Even call and discuss the activity with others in the church family as a way of staying connected.

• Participate in Hanging of the Greens at your home worship space. We won't be hanging the greens at the church building in worship, but the November 29 At-Home Worship Plan includes a full Hanging of the Greens worship service to guide you through worshipping God by hanging the greens in your home worship space (and remembering what it's like to go through the same motions in the sanctuary.)

• Watch Bonus YouTube Videos. During the Advent season, I will keep recording my sermons as I have been, but I will also make extra recordings. I will likely record myself participating in the Jesse Tree Advent Calendar activity, reading the Advent Wreath reading and lighting the Advent candles in the sanctuary, and more. I may even send playlists of my favorite Christmas songs. Watch for emails letting you know when bonus content is added. It will be available on both our church YouTube Channel and on the <sermons> tab of our website.

• Participate in Zoom activities. I don't yet know the full extent of our Advent Zoom offerings, but I plan to offer some kind of Zoom Christmas Eve service (even if we have an in-building offering), as well as some other opportunities to "gather" digitally. If you don't have Zoom downloaded on your computer, now would be a good time to do so (and to learn how to use it), so you can participate in these activities. If you need help setting it up, call on a friend in the congregation who uses Zoom.

• Worship On Your Own at the Church Building - At last night's meeting, some people expressed a desire to have the church building accessible for those who connect with God better in the sanctuary than in any other space. If you would like to worship on your own in the sanctuary, two options are available to you: (1) Call Tish in the church office and schedule a time Monday-Thursday between 9am-12pm for you to worship in the sanctuary. (2) Come to the church building on Sunday mornings between 10:30am-11:30am. I will be at the building during this time and can let you into the sanctuary. If you don't see my car or I don't answer the door right away, please call me at 970-644-2274. I will be in the building somewhere and will let you in.

• Call members of your church family to keep connected and to share Advent/ Christmas stories and cheer. It's easy to feel disconnected during this time. The best way to reconnect is to reach out to your church family with a phone call!

I know times are difficult, but we can and will be creative to discern ways to keep connected with each other and with God during this Advent season!

Changing Lives. Our second response to God is to change lives, which means to help other people. That's why so many of our ministries are focused on identifying needs and meeting them. A few examples include our Love-in-Action box, our commitment to Community Food Bank, our service at HomewardBound of the Grand Valley, our collection of school supplies, and our offering of a community garden to feed hungry people.

Time to Start Making Preparations for Advent Home Worship!

Advent is near; it begins Sunday, November 29, 2020.

Some of you may choose to spend your Sunday morning worship time here at the church building...if the COVID situation in Mesa County improves enough to allow it. But, some of you will almost certainly be worshipping at home. Since Advent is a special time, and Advent worship will involve special elements, I want to give you the opportunity to start making plans for your Advent home worship.

Here are some things you will need for worshipping at home this Advent season:

• Hanging of the Greens elements. November 29 will be our Hanging of the Greens service. I encourage you to find elements around your house to use for this service. Examples include: garland/greenery, a wreath, holly and ivy, pictures that remind you of Advent (to take the place of "banners"), a nativity scene, and your family Christmas tree.

• Candles to represent your "Advent Wreath". Each Sunday, I will supply an Advent Candle Reading with instructions for lighting a candle. You could use one candle or up to five candles for your at-home "Advent wreath".

• A candle for Christmas Eve. Whether we have a Christmas Eve service at the church building or not (and whether you're able to attend or not), I will make a Christmas Eve service available for you to use at home that will include a singing of "Silent Night" with a lit candle. (I will try to have a "live" service broadcast via Zoom from the church building.) Be thinking about and finding the candle you would like to use.

It will take some creativity, but I encourage you to do what you can to make your Advent worship special amidst COVID this year!
