

## What's happening on Christmas Eve

What is going to happen on Christmas Eve? It's a question I've been hearing quite a lot lately amidst COVID restrictions. As you know, we as a congregation have chosen to pause worship indefinitely out of Christian love and to keep worshippers safe. At the same time, we've been hoping to be able to worship together in the sanctuary on Christmas Eve. So, I get the question: what's happening on Christmas Eve? I hope you know the answer that matters. According to the gospel writer Luke:

**8** In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. **9** Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. **10** But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: **11** to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. (Luke 2:8-11, NRSV)

What's happening on Christmas Eve is that we - each of us - will be remembering and celebrating that night so long ago when angels appeared to shepherds and proclaimed Messiah's birth, that night so long ago when God sent us a King. PLEASE - don't forget that our remembrance and celebration of Jesus' birth is what this night is all about.

At the same time, I know when I receive the question that what's really being asked has to do with how we, First Christian Church, Grand Junction, will be celebrating Messiah's birth TOGETHER on Christmas Eve. So, I'll answer that for you here.

Earlier this week, I had a Webex (video conference) "meeting" with Governor Polis, the governor's COVID advisors, and Colorado faith leaders to get a sense of where Colorado is in the fight against COVID-19. Later in the day after that meeting, I had a Zoom meeting with the FCCGJ Executive Committee. Ultimately, the Executive Committee decided that the COVID situation is not at a place where it would be safe or loving to hold an in-building Christmas Eve service. We explored the option of a parking lot service, but we do not have the technology to provide such a service in a meaningful way. Yet, we still want to provide opportunities for each of you to worship and celebrate the birth of the Christ Child, and we would like to give you some kind of opportunity to worship and celebrate "together". Here's what we will offer in general terms:

- You will be provided with an At-Home Christmas Eve worship plan, similar to the Sunday morning worship plans you have been receiving. They will be delivered via email and on our website ([www.gjdisciples.org](http://www.gjdisciples.org).) For those who prefer USPS mail, we will send the At-Home Christmas Eve worship service to you via USPS.
- For those of you who prefer participating in worship by video instead of reading a worship plan, there will be a YouTube video of a Christmas Eve worship service (made available to you on Christmas Eve).
- There will also be a short LIVE worship service made available via Zoom at 7pm on Christmas Eve. It will be different from the other two services; it's purpose is to give everyone an opportunity to worship "together" for a short time on Christmas Eve, wherever you may be. Please have a candle ready, so we can participate in singing "Silent Night" together while holding lit candles.

I know these options are different from what you are used to, but each of these options is worship, each of these options will help us celebrate the true meaning of Christmas, and each of these options gives us the opportunity to be part of a community of faith (knowing that others in our faith community will be worshipping at the same time and in the same way as we are, even if we can't physically be together.)

This phrase, "Praising God", also describes our first response to the God we encounter. When we look to God, we are reminded of God's great love for us and all people shown throughout history, and our first response **MUST** be to praise. That's why we worship every Sunday, to praise God and set a pattern for praising God in our lives.

**Changing Lives.** Our second response to God is to change lives, which means to help other people. By "other people", we don't mean people within our congregation exclusively; rather, we mean all other people, especially other people in need. That's why so many of our ministries are focused on identifying needs and meeting them. A few examples include our Love-in-Action box, our commitment to Community Food Bank, our service at HomewardBound of the Grand Valley, our collection of school supplies, and our offering of a community garden to feed hungry people.

## Time to Start Making Preparations for Advent Home Worship!

Advent is near; it begins Sunday, November 29, 2020.

Some of you may choose to spend your Sunday morning worship time here at the church building...if the COVID situation in Mesa County improves enough to allow it. But, some of you will almost certainly be worshipping at home. Since Advent is a special time, and Advent worship will involve special elements, I want to give you the opportunity to start making plans for your Advent home worship.

Here are some things you will need for worshipping at home this Advent season:

- Hanging of the Greens elements. November 29 will be our Hanging of the Greens service. I encourage you to find elements around your house to use for this service. Examples include: garland/greenery, a wreath, holly and ivy, pictures that remind you of Advent (to take the place of “banners”), a nativity scene, and your family Christmas tree.
- Candles to represent your “Advent Wreath”. Each Sunday, I will supply an Advent Candle Reading with instructions for lighting a candle. You could use one candle or up to five candles for your at-home “Advent wreath”.
- A candle for Christmas Eve. Whether we have a Christmas Eve service at the church building or not (and whether you’re able to attend or not), I will make a Christmas Eve service available for you to use at home that will include a singing of “Silent Night” with a lit candle. (I will try to have a “live” service broadcast via Zoom from the church building.) Be thinking about and finding the candle you would like to use.

It will take some creativity, but I encourage you to do what you can to make your Advent worship special amidst COVID this year!


## “Simple Gifts”

One of the books that Gene and Norma Matteson gave the church library is entitled “Every Eye Beholds You” compiled by Thomas J. Craughwell in 1998. The book is a “World Treasury of Prayer” from many religions, and one of the first prayers in the book is from the Shakers. The Shakers originated in England, and coming to America they were called Shakers because of their ecstatic dancing. The text “Simple Gifts” is their most famous hymn, in part due to Aaron Copland, who borrowed it for his symphonic work “Appalachian Spring”.

Mary Hazzard, an Eldress in the Shakers, was also a superb calligrapher, and her work can be seen at the Alfred Shaker Museum in Maine. “Simple Gifts” has been sung by our own FCCGJ choir as was as “Lord of the Dance” which is an adaptation of the original melody. Go to YouTube and request each of these songs. You will find so many versions that you will spend all afternoon listening—and tapping your feet.

We read “Pilgrim’s Inn” written in 1948, which is the middle book in a trilogy of the Eliot family. The family buys an old inn named after the herb of grace (rue), and the inn, with its surrounding woods, transforms their lives in the best ways possible. Goudge’s style of writing is very descriptive transporting you back into the time just after WWII. Goudge also wrote “The Little White Horse” which is a fairy tale and won for her the prestigious Carnegie Medal.
